Staff Highlight: Cristi Richardson – Community Support Specialist



Cristi Richardson was recognized for her diligent work in the Library's Community Support Center, at a ceremony in front of the Government Office Building on March 22nd, 2024. The Wicomico County Commission for Women honored Cristi as Wicomico County Woman Leader as part of their celebration of Women's History Month.

Cristi began her career at the Library in the Mobile Services Department in July of 2021, where she was first introduced to community outreach and fell in love with working for and helping the community.

In October of 2022, she was promoted to Community Support Specialist and began her work of creating a Community Support Center at the Wicomico Public Library that is welcoming and supportive of everyone. She works hard at connecting with members of the community on a deeper level and learning about their most prominent needs. She is the personification of the Library's safe and supportive atmosphere.

Since its inception, the Community Support Center has assisted 1,046 patrons with job applications, created a community food and clothing pantry, housed five patrons and unlocked thousands of google accounts. Cristi's welcoming attitude, constant smile and infectious laughter are a huge part of the success of the Community Support Center.



Community Spotlight: Recreation & Parks



LET'S GROW TOGETHER!

Can parks and libraries be friends? James Simmons, Recreation Superintendent at Wicomico County Recreation and Parks Department and Wicomico Public Library say of course! As the second Recreation and Parks Department established in Maryland, the Rec and Parks Department has been a cornerstone in our community for over 75 years: curating programs, providing facilities, and developing activities for all ages. Wicomico Public Library is proud to have worked with Rec and Parks over the years for numerous storytimes, summer reading challenges, and the Storywalk (now in four parks!)-our relationship is only budding! The library's Mobile Learning Lab is heading to local parks for the Summerfest event series and the Bookmobile and MoLL's involvement in the County Fair (which has previously boasted 15-20,000 attendees) promises a lush future engaging with the community with exciting activities that grow the body and mind.

Recreation and Parks is focusing on creating new environmental education-based recreation, sensory storytimes, themed summer camps, and expanding on afterschool programs. Simmons describes his job as "the responsibility to create fun in the community," and WPL couldn't agree more with that mission. Sensory and artifact storytimes and hikes, upcoming environmental education-focused events, and pickleball games (plus 24 courts!) are just a few highlights of the Department's ongoing growth. The Department has also been implementing measures to make fields, courts, playgrounds, and summer camps accessible for all members of the community. WPL shares the value of meeting community needs, and Simmons agrees that our respective organizations have potential to continue growing together, this summer and beyond.
