Everyone is welcome to join the Summer Reading Challenge for good books, fun activities, and prizes! This year the Summer Reading program will be from June 1st through July 31st. If you've used Beanstack previously with Wicomico Public Library, you're all set. Log in to your account and you'll see challenges listed by reader age range.

New this year is the Summer Badge Book Bilingual Edition. This book, designed for children, perfectly matches the Beanstack App to provide engaging activities and fun stickers to mark the way to completing the summer challenge. Stickers visually match the badges earned on Beanstack! Don't overlook the guest book found on the last few pages, make this badge book a fun keepsake for years to come.

The Summer Reading Challenge is found on Beanstack using a web browser at wicomicolibrary.beanstack.org, or using the Beanstack App. The app can be downloaded from the Apple App store or Google Play. Paper game boards are available in this magazine, they can be downloaded from www.wicomicolibrary.org, or they can be picked up along with badge books at any Wicomico Public Library location.

For the little ones, parents have the option to use the badge book or to use a more simplified gameboard. Badge book activities are designed for ages 5 and older.

Teens are encouraged to read 10 books this summer! Find book recommendations throughout the summer on the library's website and social media. Novels, non-fiction books, manga, graphic novels, choose your preferred style and meet your reading goals.

Adults are not left out of the Summer Reading Challenge! Do audiobooks count? Do cookbooks count? Yes, they do. The goal is 10 books. 
