SPRING BOOK SALE

Our most recent book sale was a HUGE success, resulting in several new records being set for this event! We are pleased to announce that we generated a total of \$6,581.85 in sales – the highest profit we have achieved since we began holding our biannual book sales. That includes our highest ever Friends preview night, our highest ever single day of sales (\$2,846.16 during just our first day of the sale), and the sale of 30 tote bags full of books during our Bag of Books promotion at the end of the sale. We take pride in knowing that our sale resulted in having 2,741 individual books placed in the hands of many eager readers of all ages!



A FUN VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY!

Our Book Store continues to draw more and more attention and to be a popular place for patrons to visit when they stop by the downtown branch of the library. However, our hours of operation are solely dependent on volunteer availability. It is our goal to provide this popular service on a consistent basis, but your help is needed!

This is a fantastic way to find new, gently-used, inexpensive books to read while interacting with other book lovers as you help them locate books and audiovisual materials that meet their interests and needs. Most of our Book Store volunteers find they enjoy this fun experience so much, that they make it a priority to arrange their schedules so that they can volunteer on a weekly basis! However, we still find that there are times when the store must occasionally be closed due to a lack of volunteers. Thus, we are always looking for new people who would be willing to occasionally donate a couple of hours of their time to work a shift.

Training is very basic and only requires one hour of your time. It is not necessary to commit to any specific schedule once you begin helping in the Book Store – you simply sign up whenever you are available, according to whatever time you are willing/able to give.
