Library Update: Executive Director, Seth Hershberger

As we look toward the year ahead, it's hard not to notice the sense of forward motion taking shape across the library system. Construction is now underway at the Sarbanes Library on Schumaker Pond, a visible sign of long-planned transformation becoming real, while construction at the new Riley Library in Parsonsburg has concluded, with final preparations underway and an opening date to be announced soon. Alongside new voices joining the Board of Trustees and moments set aside to recognize staff, these milestones speak to a shared commitment to investing in spaces, people, and services that will serve the community well into the future.

That work, of course, does not begin or end with buildings. Inside our libraries, and increasingly beyond their walls, staff continue the steady, thoughtful work of connecting people with ideas, stories, and one another. In the months ahead, that includes programs like the Storywalk at Riverwalk Park, seasonal reading challenges for children and adults, and familiar favorites such as Baby & Me Storytime, Computer Tutor and STEAM-focused classes, Homeschool Hub gatherings, and Booked for the Weekend book discussions, along with many others offered across our branches and through the Bookmobile. I'm grateful to the staff who bring our library spaces to life day after day, and to our patrons whose curiosity and participation give it meaning. Together, we are shaping a library system that reflects the interests and needs of Wicomico County, and I'm thankful to be part of that mission.







WATER DRESSED IN BROWN: THE IMPORTANCE OF PLACE IN WRITING*

SAT: 4/18; 1:00PM–2:00PM

Join local author Dan O'Hare for a conversation about his novel, *Water Dressed in Brown*, and the importance of place in writing. Ages 18+

"As the first two kids in the newly developed community of Ocean Pines, Maryland, Laura and Trey are thrown together constantly, inevitably becoming best friends. In the autumn of their junior year of high school, just as their friendship might be developing into something more, a sudden violent night changes everything." (from the cover)

This April, Wicomico Public Library will be hosting a very special event: a writers-on-writers conversation with local authors Dan O'Hare and TJ West. This event, which will take place on April 18, will be a conversation between two local writers whose work engages with space, place, and home. O'Hare is from right here on the Eastern Shore, while West is a transplant from West Virginia. The particular focus of the conversation will be O'Hare's new novel, *Water Dressed in Brown*, a novel all about self-discovery, coming of age, and being a young person in the 1990s on Maryland's Eastern Shore.

Dan O'Hare was born and raised on Delmarva and, according to local history, was the first person born in the residential community of Ocean Pines. This location plays a key role in his novel, *Water Dressed in Brown*, which is not just set on the Eastern Shore but truly manages to capture the feel of this special place during the 1990s, what the book jacket refers to as "the waning days of the analogue age." As soon as you start reading, you will find yourself swept up in O'Hare's prose, which is marked, among other things, by a precise attention to sensory detail. He's one of those writers who just knows how to enmesh the readers in the particularities of setting.

Among other things, O'Hare intuitively understands the unique beauty of the Eastern Shore, and he draws particular attention to the importance of light. The various locations upon which he draws have a major impact on both the plot and the characters. "The thing about Ocean Pines, Ocean City, and the rural fields outside of Snow Hill is they offer 3 very distinct types of lights," he says. "The darkness of Ocean Pines is almost oppressive. But perhaps creates a fearlessness in the unknown for Laura. The blinking yellow lights of Ocean City create a feeling of being in between worlds. And the light pollution prevents stars from being seen. And the rural fields surrounding the Rickety House allow Laura to really see the stars for the first

time. Having these three locations so close together made this location perfect."

In addition to capturing the specific atmosphere of the Eastern Shore, O'Hare also knows how to immerse the reader in a very particular time with its own rhythms and atmosphere. As anyone who grew up in the 1980s and 1990s can attest, the era was one far less reliant on technology than the one we live in today. "I avoided technology as much as possible, with the exception of the CD player Christmas gift," O'Hare says about his efforts to ground the novel in the specificity of the 1990s. "That, plus the time spent talking about mixtapes was probably the main way I grounded the story in a time and place." Anyone who has read *Water Dressed in Brown* can attest to just how skillfully he's managed to evoke the feeling of a bygone era.

Of course, writing a book that's so firmly rooted in the local comes with some challenges, particularly when it comes to making such a work appealing to a broader audience. O'Hare, however, has learned one thing that's most important for any author: write the story that you want to read. As any good writer knows, authenticity is not just about staying true to yourself; it's also about forging an important and enduring connection between the author and the readers who pick up their books. It's perhaps for this reason that *Water Dressed in Brown* has become so popular here in Salisbury and in the greater Eastern Shore. It's not just that the novel represents the area; it's that it does it with heart, with integrity, and with authenticity. That's the power of place in writing.

Even though *Water Dressed in Brown* has already been a success, O'Hare isn't one to rest on his laurels. He's already hard at work on his next project, a middle reader fantasy/fairy tale called *Ogreheart*. Given the extent to which he was able to bring more than a little magic to his novel set in the real world, it's a certainty that his next book will be even more enchanting.
